

The Elizabeth Gray Danforth Scholarship

- Provides two-year, full-tuition scholarships to students from the St. Louis Community College system who transfer to Washington University.
- Scholarship recipients are chosen for
 - · academic excellence
 - enthusiasm for learning
 - · clarity of goals
 - potential for leadership
 - dedication to community service

WHO IS ELIGIBLE

- Qualified students from any of the four St. Louis Community College campuses who have applied and are admitted as transfer students to Washington University are considered for this unique and competitive scholarship.
- Students must complete 60 transferable credit hours from St. Louis Community College by the end of the spring semester.
- Applicants must present at least a B+ average in courses across a broad academic curriculum.
- · The application process is open to all genders.
- There are no age limitations for student eligibility.

THE IDA H. EARLY STUDENT START-UP GRANT

Students who are selected for The Elizabeth Gray Danforth Scholarship will also receive a one-time grant up to \$2,000 for indirect educational expenses such as housing, supplies, books, and other expenditures to assist with their transition as a first-year student at Washington University.

Transfer Admission Guidelines

Transfer admission to Washington University is both selective and competitive.

Some academic divisions require specific prerequisites. For example, students with interests in Engineering, Business, or the physical or biological sciences must present a strong background in science and mathematics, including calculus.

Applicants must intend to major in a curriculum offered at Washington University.

HOW TO APPLY TO WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY

- Instructions on how to apply to Washington
 University can be found at admissions.wustl.edu.
- Submit proof of high school diploma or equivalent, and an official transcript from your current institution.
- International students whose first language is not English are required to submit the TOEFL, IELTS, or the Duolingo English Test (DET) scores.
- Application must be submitted by **March 1**.

INTERVIEW

- Applicants selected by Washington University's Admissions Office as finalists will be notified and asked to interview in early April.
- The Women's Society Scholarship Committee will interview the finalists and select the scholarship recipient.
