







Dwight David Eisenhower II

Grandson of General and President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Dwight David Eisenhower II is a noted historian of World War II and the Cold War. His 1986 bestseller. "Eisenhower: At War 1943– 1945," was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in History. Eisenhower received a B.A. in history cum laude from Amherst College. Following graduation, he served in the United States Naval Reserve for three years as an officer on the USS Albany; shortly afterward, he earned his I.D. cum laude from The George Washington University Law School. Today, Eisenhower is Senior Fellow of the Foreign Policy Research Institute and a Public Policy Fellow at the Annenberg School of Communication and the School of Arts and Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania, where he teaches "Communication and the Presidency."

Battle of Sicily: Operation Husky

Meet Professor Eisenhower on a specially arranged visit to the **Sicily-Rome American Cemetery and Memorial**, where 7,845 of American military war dead from World War II are buried. These casualties are from the July 10 to August 17, 1943 Allied battles to liberate Sicily, the September 9, 1943 landings in Salerno and the 1944 landings at Anzio Beach. Learn more about the history of these critical campaigns as Eisenhower reflects on his grandfather's World War II legacy and the battles waged here that helped bring the Allies to victory in Europe.



bath houses and a 20,000-seat amphitheater. On the fateful August day that tephra from Vesuvius buried the city under a shroud of volcanic ash, an estimated 2,000 people perished beneath it. Pompeii and those who died in the city remained entombed for nearly 17 centuries. The petrified city was discovered in 1748 by explorers who found it astoundingly frozen in time, preserved by the volcanic ash that destroyed it.

Today, the excavated ruins of Pompeii are a UNESCO World Heritage site that offers a rare glimpse of the daily rituals of Roman life during the reign of Emperor Titus. Your immersive tour of this astounding archaeological landmark explores the lavishly adorned Vetti family estate and the city's extraordinary amphitheater — the earliest surviving stone amphitheater of the Roman world — for a journey through antiquity like no other.

Livorno for Tuscany Day 3 | June 22

Arrive in Livorno and choose from one of two included Traveler's Choice excursions in Tuscany. The first option is a tour of Florence that includes a visit to the Fine Arts Academy to see Michelangelo's legendary statue of David. The second choice is a tour of the 16th-century walled city of Lucca and a visit to magnificent Villa Reale di Marlia. (B,L,D)

Porto Venere/ Cinque Terre Day 4 | June 23

Enjoy extraordinary views as the ship arrives in the medieval town

of Porto Venere. Disembark after breakfast for a private boat cruise to the astounding Cinque Terre, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Visit two of its iconic cliffside villages — Vernazza and Monterosso with time at leisure to explore at your own pace. You will have the option to return to the ship for lunch or remain in Porto Venere for lunch on your own and have extra time to enjoy the coastal scenery. Attend the Captain's Welcome Reception on board this evening. (B,L,R,D)

Bonifacio, France Day 5 | June 24

Today, the ship arrives in Bonifacio on the French island of Corsica. Your discovery of this dramatically situated medieval town begins with a tram ride from the harbor to the Haute Ville, or upper town, and around the plateau to

savor panoramic views. You will then stroll through Bonifacio's ninth-century citadel, perched high on a limestone promontory, to see historic landmarks such as Place Bir Hakeim, St. Jean Baptiste church and Le Grain de Sable — a weathered rock formation that appears to collapse into the sea. Enjoy the Jardin des Vestiges and see the house where Napoleon stayed. (B.L.D)

Sorrento for Pompeii Day 6 | June 25

Enjoy breakfast with views of Sorrento, an outpost of the ancient Roman Republic and the scenic gateway to Mount Vesuvius and Pompeii. Explore the ancient petrified city of Pompeii on foot to see the wealthy Vetti family estate and the extraordinary amphitheater — the earliest surviving stone amphitheater of the Roman world — and Temple of Jupiter.









You will have the option to return to the ship for lunch or stay in Sorrento for lunch on your own. Shuttle busses will provide transportation from the port to the Sorrento city center.

Later this afternoon, immerse yourself in Sorrento's local traditions on a walking tour that includes a chance to learn the secrets of limoncello and experience a tasting of the popular Italian liqueur. Those who prefer to continue exploring Sorrento at leisure may do that instead of the tour. This evening, enjoy a traditional tarantella performance, featuring traditional Neapolitan songs and dance. (B,L,D)

Sorrento/Amalfi/ Isle of Capri Day 7 | June 26

Admire the natural splendor of the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Amalfi Coast on a panoramic drive that takes you past its sun-drenched beaches to the medieval village of Amalfi. Enjoy a short orientation tour and some time on your own to explore the charming local boutiques and cafes. Return to the ship for lunch on board as we sail to Capri.

Disembark this afternoon for a tour of captivating Capri, the island where, legend has it, Homer's Odysseus resisted the alluring call of the sirens.

Visit the Augustus Gardens, a series of serene, flower-filled terraces that have breathtaking panoramas of the Faraglioni rock formations rising from translucent waters and the craggy peak of Mount Solaro, the highest point on the island. You will also see the ancient perfumery of Carthusia — the smallest fragrance laboratory in the world. (B,L,D)

Nettuno Day 8 | June 27

The ship arrives in Nettuno for a special excursion with Guest Speaker Dwight David Eisenhower II to visit the Sicily-Rome American Cemetery and Memorial. Learn more about the importance of the Allied campaigns in Sicily during World War II and join Eisenhower in honoring the 7,845 American military war dead who are buried here. A chapel shows the names of 3,095 who are still missing.

Tonight, attend the Captain's Farewell Reception with your fellow travelers. (B.L.R.D)
